Birth to 36 Months	<b>Early Intervention</b>	<p>The North Carolina Early Intervention Branch (NCEI) is a part of the N.C. Division of Public Health. It is the lead agency for the N.C. Infant-Toddler Program (ITP). The Infant-Toddler Program provides support and services for families and their children, birth to three who have special needs. Children aged zero to three with certain levels of developmental delay or established conditions, and their families, are eligible for the ITP. No family is denied services because of the inability to pay. Services that are offered are service coordination, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech-language therapy, family support, special instruction, and assistive technology. Services are provided within the child's natural environment as a part of their everyday routines and activities in which families participate and in places where families would typically be. When services take place, children can be at home with their families or at places within the community like the park, playground or daycare with other care providers. 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36 Months - Kindergarten	<b>Preschool Exceptional Children's Program</b>	The Preschool Exceptional Children's Program promotes the development of preschool-age children with special needs. We offer developmental screenings, evaluations and services free of charge. Services could include: Speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, social skills training, pre-academic skills support, and parent training. Currently there are two classrooms at Gatesville Elementary that serve the county's preschool children, regardless of their home-school district. These classes are blended with the NC Pre-K classes. 0 - 5 Years	<b>CC4C <u>Care Coordination for Children</u></b>	CC4C is a program offered at no charge to children who have long term medical conditions or special health care needs, are dealing with challenging levels of stress, are in foster care, or are referred by a community agency or doctor. 0 - 5 Years	<b>Parents as Teachers Program (PAT)</b>	PAT provides parents with information on appropriate child development, provides parenting support, helps detect developmental delays and health issues, and increases school readiness skills. Services will include personal visits twice a month for each family (2) regular group connections (3) annual developmental screenings and functional assessments; and (4) referrals to community resources provided to families as needed. 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0-5 Years	<b>SafeCare Parenting Program</b>	SafeCare is an evidence-based, home visiting program, for parents of children 5 years old or younger who are at-risk for or have been involved with child neglect or maltreatment. SafeCare Providers work with families in their homes to improve parents skills in three areas: 1) Parent-infant/child interactions 2) Home safety and 3) Child health care. Includes wrap-around care for children attending other publicly funded part-day programs such as NC Pre-K, Head Start or Developmental Day Schools.
